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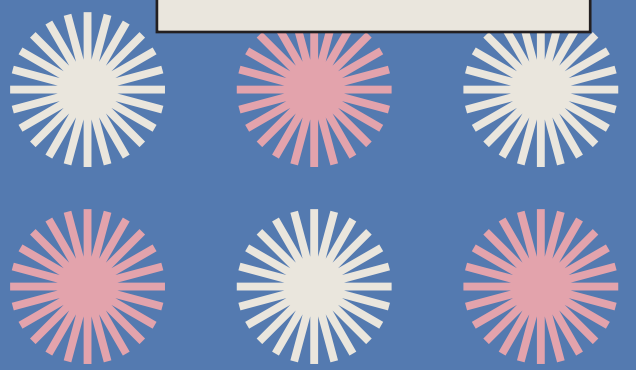

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

There is no right way to be a dad, but it helps to have the proper tools for success. Our Nurturing Fathers curriculum is a 13-week evidence-based training course that utilizes activities and discussions to address the history of fatherhood and new, nurturing practices. Alongside the curriculum, we offer 1:1 peer mentoring sessions and support groups just for dads.

REAL DADS BEHIND THE PROGRAM

EDWARD became involved with the Child Welfare System nine years ago when his children were temporarily removed due to substance use and domestic violence in the home. After completing a case plan and a variety of classes, his children were returned to his care and have been with him ever since. He now aims to help struggling families succeed, so they can avoid the path he took and their families can remain intact.

A 2021 Casey Excellence for Children Birth Father Award Winner, Edward serves as the Program and Services Development Manager at the Family Involvement Center. He's also involved as a parent leader with the Alliance Parent Partnership Council and is active with the Birth Parent National Network.
